MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 1908, on three acres of leased land, West End House Camp was founded. At that time there was one wooden building ("Wildmere") and many tents that welcomed the hardy West End kids. Now our modern 160 acre facility beckons hundreds of boys to the shores of Long Pond for weeks of fun and excitement. I thank each of you for being part of our history!

1986 was a truly exciting year at Camp. Nature and archery were revived and were under expert supervision; the old camping trails and campsite across the pond were opened up; Red Cross certified instructors were present both for swimming and for sailing; July 4th was spent at the ballpark in Old Orchard as the Maine Guides defeated the Pawtucket Red Sox - we were probably the only ones cheering for the Sox and were lucky we weren't thrown out of the park! The number of intercamp games was increased to meet the needs and desires of many and we held two basketball tournaments at Camp also. Both the "Cornish" Fair and Funtown welcomed us and our money during the summer and Pizza Barn stock always shoots up when we are in the area. Visiting Day saw the campers put on a play; Mother Nature staged some showers of her own, but that afternoon did clear up enough to allow for visitors to be able to stay outdoors and enjoy the beauty of the Camp. Color War lasted the planned five days, despite a tornado warning, severe thunder and lightning storms, and the sporadic torrential rains that ruined many a pair of sneakers. Foreign campers arrived from Italy, West Germany and Colombia not only to enjoy Camp but also to teach Gerry Walsh some English. Leading Reg put on a demonstration of computers early in the season, Camp Huckins welcomed us for a dance in early July, and the Allston-Brighton Burger King personally delivered all kinds of burgers, pies, potato salad, cole slaw and hats for an end of year party! Finally, in between "raindrops falling on our heads," we played leagues, had waterfront activities, and did a variety of evening activities.

All in all, quite a summer! Many of the people responsible for its success have made their own remarks in the 1986 Spirit, but I do want to single out a few.

Joe Kaplan has been Chairman of the Camp Committee for many years and Michael Cataldo has been Co-Chairman and Corporation President for almost as long! These two men spend much time with Camp affairs all year long, and to them goes my gratitude for their advice and direction.

Michael Lesburg and Alex "Yogi" Berger have both been very active in Camp Committee affairs and have donated much in the area of time and items to the Camp - thank you!

Tom "Popeye" Cook was a tremendous chef and a great person who labored long, hard and willingly in providing us with quality food, including homemade bread. Thanks, Tom, and thanks to the kitchen crew of Kerry Callahan, Domingo Morales and Miguel Morales. Appreciation also to Tom's wife, Barbara, for helping out and for taking care of Gillian.

Dr. Charles Schlosberg, Camp Medical Director, again ensured top quality medical care and personnel at Camp. "Doc Charlie" has always been there for us and when he gave up a job in the Catskills in 1929 to come to Camp was the best thing for us! Thanks also to Dr. Leslie Blachman (and entourage!) and Dr. David Daigh for their help in 1986.

Registered Nurse Joanne Houde came to her interview in May at the Club enthusiastically looking forward to being part of Camp and despite the usual illnesses and accidents - real and imagined - remained enthusiastic and committed to our medical needs all during the year. Thank you, Joanne, for your concern and professionalism. Good luck with your future plans - feel free to take with you some of your favorites you mention in your message.

To the staff - especially to Gerry (with a "G") Walsh - my gratitude. Gerry always had great surprises awaiting my arrival back to Camp from Boston!

Finally - best for last - Dwight Day keeps the Camp together 52 weeks a year. He is the most valuable person here - quiet and dedicated, so very talented. Thank you, Dwight - words will never express our feelings of gratitude for your tremendous efforts on our behalf. Special thanks to Linda Day, Joseph and Jerry for their visits and help. They are all very much part of the West End House Family.

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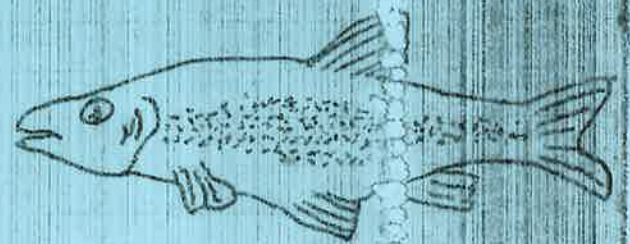
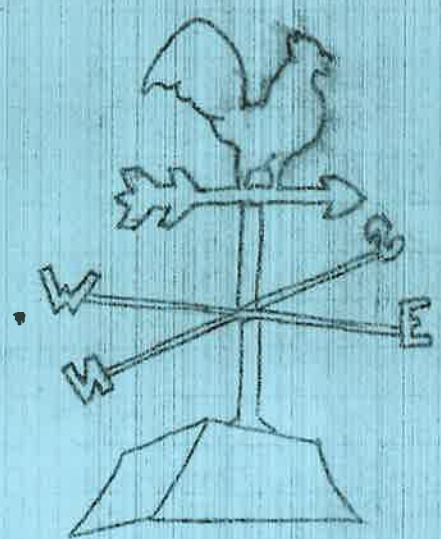
